### **OLYMPIC SIZE SPACE**

Something extraordinary is happening here at Friargate this autumn.

The amount of earth we have excavated to create the basement for Two Friargate has now reached enough to fill more than three Olympic size swimming pools.

The 15,000 metric tonnes of earth we've taken from the site will be recycled into other building projects. But all this work means the basement space now measures 4 metres deep and will soon be home to all of the foundations from which the rest of this 13 storey building will rise.

At 60 metres, we won't guite hit the heights of the surviving steeple of Coventry Cathedral, which at 87 metres will remain the tallest structure in the city (and the third tallest church steeple in the UK).

But every great building has a beginning, and as the basement completes, this will mark the structural beginning of Two Friargate as the slipform core then rises to become a landmark in its own right and the rest of the superstructure is then built around it, floor by floor.

The subsequent steelwork for the building will eventually total 1,100 tonnes – or the weight of eight fully grown Blue whales – the largest animals that have ever lived on planet Earth.

The steelwork supports the full 136,000 sq foot of office space across the building and will eventually carry the weight of up to 1,500 people who will work in the building in the future.
