Our landmark and innovative new 134,000 sq ft office building, **Two Friargate**, was recently topped out in a traditional ceremony.

Attended by the construction team and local supporters, including Councillor Jim O'Boyle of Coventry City Council and Chief Executive WMCA Laura Shoaf, the event marked the building reaching its full structural height.

The work is now mainly inside the building where the scope of the fit-out has been extended to include additional floors.

This has extended the construction programme which will now lead to completion of the entire building in April 2023. The public realm and hard landscaping at the base of the building is being laid right now and local people will be able to see the results as the hoarding and fencing is removed. The Boulevard will be restored to its full width in the Spring.

With open plan offices capable of being shaped around individual business needs, Two Friargate's space and specification offers flexible solutions across the full range of office requirements.

THE RETURN OF THE CHERRY TREES

The Cherry trees that previously formed a natural edge to the Boulevard have been safely stored during construction and will be returning to site shortly, ready to blossom once more next spring.

The trees are much travelled having started life in a Dutch nursery before planting and spending five years in Coventry.

During construction, the trees were removed for protection but will now be making a very happy return to Friargate.
